NO-KILL is not just a number, IT'S A PHILOSOPHY.



As a philosophical principle, it means saving every dog and cat in a shelter who can be saved.

Why \$ 90%?

We designate shelters that meet the 90% save-rate benchmark as no-kill.

Typically, the number of pets suffering from irreparable medical or behavioral issues compromising their quality of life is not more than 10% of all dogs and cats entering shelters.



NO-KILL IS NOT

- Saving every animal entering a shelter, regardless of medical or behavioral issues or quality of life
- Blaming, attacking, or vilifying shelter personnel
- Putting public safety at risk

The no-kill philosophy acknowledges that

euthanasia may sometimes be an appropriate choice in rare cases of irremediable canine aggression in which public safety cannot be reasonably assured and other interventions would compromise the animal's quality of life.

Within animal welfare, we hope to reduce the controversy by helping both the public and members of our industry understand what the term means, what it doesn't mean, and how people can be a positive part of helping their shelter achieve it.
